### **On the cover:**

This month we have a surprise from deep within Ian Johnson's Inner sanctum...

It is a giant scale F4U Corsair. He's been working on this beauty on and off for the past five years. What started as a Top Flite kit but has been heavily modified to have more fidelity to scale. He hopes to be soon competing in large scale with the bird. He says it's been a considerable undertaking and a huge learning curve. He's nearly finished the wing, but is bending his brain on those characteristic Corsair flaps.

Some Specs:

The wingspan is 87". It will be powered by a Zenoah 62cc with an ultra quiet muffler. Retracts including retractable tail wheel and scale wheels are from Robart and radio gear and servo's from Futaba (all high torque).

The entire model will be glassed and finished in the Navy colours of VF-17's ace pilot Merl Davenport.

We look forward to seeing more of this impressive warbird from Ian.

### **AWA Report:**

The AWA report was presented by Ken Greaves.

Following the recent incident of a model aircraft being flown close to a commercial passenger aircraft near Perth airport, CASA and MAAA have released a pamphlet to advise model aircraft pilots of their obligations when operating their aircraft. These will be distributed through model aircraft retail outlets and other appropriate venues.

The new Dardenup field has had a boost with \$15,000 being contributed by the Lotteries Commission and \$20,000 by the South West Development Corporation.

There appears to be continuing support for the development of a Silver Wings programme and therefore the probability of this new achievement award going ahead is now considered to be high.

### General Business from the Floor:

#### **1. Field Manager**

Eric Gooch was appointed as the Field Manager. The President thanked Eric for taking on this role as it is critical to the successful operation of the KAMS facilities.

#### **2. Noise & Flyover**

KAMS has received a complaint from a neighbour that was concerned with the overflying of her property by a "large model". The issue was raised due to her concern for her children and her horses and in particular the consequences of a horse becoming "spooked" while being ridden or handled by one of her children. The Safety Officer has spoken to the person responsible for the overflight and has made it clear to the individual of the serious consequences to KAMS should this behaviour continue. The individual has agreed to comply with the rules of KAMS in future. The neighbour is satisfied with the actions of the committee. Safety officer has spoken to person involved as to serious implications to KAMS. Member has been counseled and has undertaken to comply.

The neighbour also advised that "there is a large noisy aircraft at the field". The aircraft responsible was identified and the Safety Officer has spoken to the member concerned and requested that he work towards an 80dBA level as specified in the By-Laws of KAMS.

The President made it clear to the meeting that the behaviour of the two individuals concerned placed the future of KAMS at risk and the actions of one or two could impact all members of the Society. Three levels of action will be taken where a report of gross transgression of the rules continues and the allegations are found to be substantiated:

1. A verbal warning will be issued.
2. A warning letter will be sent.
3. The member will be requested to leave KAMS.

#### **3. Pylon Events**

Following the discussion at last months general meeting the committee will allocate two Saturday time slots over the summer months and the Pylon SIG will be able to run their events in terms of the conditions that are laid out in the August Committee Meeting Minutes (Item GB7).

#### **4. Open Day**

The President outlined the concept of an Open Fly-In weekend towards the end of the coming summer. The membership was requested to consider the concept for discussion at the next meeting.

#### **5. Insurance**

The former insurer of KAMS no longer insures property's such as the field. Through his business contacts, the

President has arranged a comprehensive policy which covers the requirements of KAMS. An important aspect of the policy is that it covers the replacement cost of the improvements at the field.

**6. Canteen**

The President has had a discussion with the Canteen Manager and requested that several improvements be made including expanding the range of products available to members and improving the standard of cleanliness of the canteen. The replacement of the fittings within the canteen was discussed and the committee will follow this through to action.

**7. Furniture at Field**

The President raised the matter of the poor state of the furniture at the field and it was generally agreed that these required replacement.

It was moved that an amount of \$500 be allocated for the replacement of garden furniture at the field.

**8. Woodwork Show at Claremont Showgrounds**

Eric Gooch expressed his thanks to those members that assisted him at the recent Woodwork Show. Their efforts were much appreciated.

**9. Slipstream**

Members were requested to assist in making *Slipstream* a vibrant and interesting publication by providing articles to the editor. The Safety Officer will be running a series of reminders to members about rules that are often overlooked. The first topic will be By-Law 5.3 which is concerned with the running of engines in the pit area. He reminded members that this applies to all engines – electric, turbine and internal combustion.

**10. Free Flight Calendar for 2010**

The first Free Flight Scramble and Hand Launch event for 2010 will be held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> May at 1500. The organizer is Ian Dixon.

**11. Filing Cabinet**

Any member who has a spare filing cabinet is requested to advise the Secretary as another is required for the storage of the KAMS archives.

**12. Powerpoints**

Member Barry Beeston was thanked for the electrical and energy audit that he recently completed. Barry has provided extended power points and these will be installed shortly by an electrician.

**13. Warbirds**

Warbirds is to be held on 25<sup>th</sup> October. The essential criteria for entering an aircraft is that it must display military insignia or it cannot fly. Last year's event gained national recognition through an RCM new article and it is hoped that this year event will attract a similar level of interest.

**14. Entrance Road and Car Park**

Members were requested to observe the speed limit on the entry road and to take care in the carpark as traveling at speed causes damage to the roadways. There is a need to resurface the entrance road and to replace the speed humps to assist with speed limit compliance.

The clearance of unwanted material around the car park area is to be completed during the coming months.

**15. Tim Kullack**

Tim recently competed in the recent F3B World Championships in Brno. It is believed that he came 36<sup>th</sup> overall and the meeting was reminded that this was in a very high quality field where the top competitors have the opportunity to compete in events every second week throughout the northern hemispheres summer. An example of the improvement in the quality of aircraft and pilot is that time of 13.4 seconds were being achieved in the speed events whereas two years ago times in the 14 second range were considered the peak of achievement. The meeting congratulated Tim on his efforts and requested that the Secretary forward a letter of congratulations and offer our support for him the support of KAMS for his next challenge.

#### Instructors:

## General Business

### GB1 **Canteen**

Members Glenn Baldwin and Chris Martin are working on plans to refurbish the canteen. It is envisaged that the layout will be changed to facilitate more working bench space, the cupboards and bench tops will be upgraded and the walls will be painted.

### GB2 **Web Site**

No progress was made during the month on mapping out the updates that are required to the web site.

### GB3 **Slipstream**

The President urged all committee members to work pro-actively to get more articles that are of interest to members for *Slipstream* to make it more interesting for our readers.

### GB4 **Electrical**

There has been some difficulty obtaining the services of an electrician (at the right price) to make the necessary changes that were identified by the audit undertaken by member Barry Beeston. Barry advised the meeting that a contractor's ticket is required to undertake the work. If work is undertaken that is not in accordance with the regulations then it will nullify the insurance should there be a misadventure. Barry will approach his boss to see if he can do the work under his ticket.

### GB5 **Insurance**

Insurance has been arranged through the insurance broker, Unity Insurance (Mr Phil Hall) to cover the KAMS property, it's assets at replacement cost and public liability. An invoice will issued shortly.

### GB6 **Field Management and Works Programme**

#### **Driveway and Parking Area**

The Field Manager, Eric Gooch advised that he is organizing through member Ken Heinz for road base to be delivered to the field this week. It will be used to fill the car park where large pools of water are currently forming.

It was noted that a number of members drive at excessive speed on entry to the field. This is causing corrugations to form and the roadway to generally deteriorate. Members are to be reminded that the speed limit at the field is 15kph. This is for reasons of safety and to preserve the roadway. To assist in regulating the speed of traffic a couple of speed humps are to be re-established.

#### **Paving**

Eric Gooch proposed that KAMS take advantage of the numerous offers of paving for free provided the acquirer is willing to remove it from its current location. With the support of members (not just a show of hands, but hands-on) Eric can arrange brick paving to upgrade the member's area. The following proposal is to be put to the forthcoming General Meeting:

- ***That paving be acquired to replace the current grassed areas between the shelter and the safety fence. This includes the replacement of the three current grass strips: the one in front of the canteen around the flag pole; the long one in front of the shelter and the smaller one closest to the western pits area, which is suffers from salt encrustation.***
- ***It is also proposed that the grassed area in front of the transmitter pound be paved as the current grassed area is badly degraded and requires a lot of maintenance to recover over summer only to see it degrade the next winter.***

#### **Fencing**

Eric Gooch advised the meeting that there is a large section of fencing that needs to be maintained and/or replaced. This includes the entire northern boundary (adjacent to Jackson Road) and approximately half of the fence line on the eastern boundary (that closest to the hills). The fences are considered an important part of the field as it keeps sheep and other stray animals from entering the field. Eric will arrange for a fencing contractor to provide a quotation for the repair and/or replacement of this section of fencing.

#### **Fox Baiting**

A fox baiting programme is being progressed in collaboration with other land owners in the area. The baiting is necessary to protect local stock and fauna that uses the nature strip adjacent to the northern boundary of the field. The baiting programme that uses 1080 is an initiative of the Serpentine-Jarrahdale Landcare Group which coordinates the baiting activities as required in conjunction with the Serpentine- Jarrahdale Shire Council and under the control of the Department of Agriculture and Food. The baits are subsidized. The baiting of the field will take place during the months of October and November.

### Repair of Gate

Eric Gooch will coordinate the repair of the entrance gate to make it easier to close and lock.

### Field Maintenance

There options for the maintenance of the field this year were discussed. The Field Manager will investigate if the field needs to be verti-mown and sanded this year or just sanded.

### GB8 **Events Calendar**

#### GB8.1 **Fly-in Event**

Following the support for this event at the last General Meeting, the meeting agreed with the following:

- Committee member Andy Peryer will be the Event Director (ED).
- The event will be held over two days of a weekend in late April or early May.
- The event will be run around a series of focused activities that will be based on the interests of various Special Interest Groups (SIGs).
- The events will be competitive in a fun way with awards being made for the activities of each SIG.
- The event is a "fly-in", not a public display, although the public will be welcome.
- Promotion will be through the normal RC aviation medium and the local press.
- Andy Peryer will be responsible for visiting the retail outlets to garner support for prizes.

#### GB8.2 **Calendar for 2010**

All SIGS are to be requested to submit their planned activities for 2010 by 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2009 so that the calendar for 2010 can be prepared. The secretary is responsible for forwarding the requests.

### GB11 **Facilities**

#### GB11.1 **Garden Furniture**

A budget of \$500 was allocated at the last general meeting. Committee member Andy Peryer will investigate what furniture is suitable for the field and what the cost will be and report back to the next meeting.

### GB12 **Community Liaison**

The President, Geoff Doughty will continue to fulfill this role.
